

**THE GLASGOW CITY COUNCIL  
(HAWTHORN STREET)  
(TRAFFIC REGULATION) ORDER 202\_**

Glasgow City Council proposes to consider the introduction of the above named Traffic Regulation Order in terms of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.

The purpose of this Order is to enable the provision of on carriageway cycle facilities on Hawthorn Street. Therefore enabling safer and more sustainable travel options within the local area and connections to the wider cycle network.

The roads affected by these proposals are bounded by:-

- Balmore Road to the western extent, Memel Street to the eastern extent.

The list of roads affected by these proposals are:-

- Hawthorn Street

Details of the proposed Order

The proposed Order (as depicted on the attached plans) will comprise of :-

**No waiting at any time No loading or unloading at any time**

**Hawthorn Street**

- On the south side (westbound Carriageway), from the extended east kerbline of Balmore Road, Eastwards to the extended west kerbline of Memel Street.
- On the North side (eastbound carriageway), from the extended east kerbline of Balmore Road, Eastwards to the extended West kerbline of Ashfield Street.
- On the North side (eastbound carriageway), from the extended east kerbline of Finlas Street, Eastwards to the extended west kerbline of Memel Street.

**Prohibition of being in a Mandatory with flow cycle lane**

**Hawthorn Street**

- On the south side (westbound Carriageway), from the extended east kerbline of Balmore Road, Eastwards to the extended west kerbline of Memel Street.
- On the North side (eastbound carriageway), from the extended east kerbline of Balmore Road, Eastwards to the extended West kerbline of Ashfield Street.
- On the North side (eastbound carriageway), from the extended east kerbline of Finlas Street, Eastwards to the extended west kerbline of Memel Street.
