

**THE GLASGOW CITY COUNCIL
(ROYSTON ROAD ACTIVE TRAVEL)
(TRAFFIC REGULATION) ORDER 202_**

Glasgow City Council proposes to consider the introduction of the above named Traffic Regulation Order in terms of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.

The purpose of this Order is to enable the provision of on carriageway cycle facilities on Royston Road. Therefore enabling safer and more sustainable travel options within the local area and connections to the wider cycle network.

The roads affected by these proposals are bounded by:-

- Siemens Street to the western extent, Provanmill Road to the eastern extent.

The list of roads affected by these proposals are:-

- Royston Road

Details of the proposed Order

The proposed Order (as depicted on the attached plans) will comprise of :-

Prohibition of being in a Two Way cycle lane

Royston Road

- On the South side from the extended East kerbline of Siemens Street, Eastwards to the extended West kerbline of Provanmill Road.

No waiting and no loading at any time

Royston Road

- On the South side from the extended East kerbline of Siemens Street, Eastwards to the extended West kerbline of Provanmill Road.
