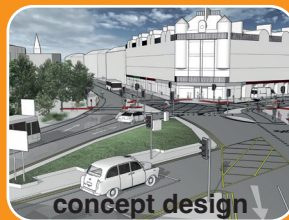


Connecting Woodside

Glasgow City Council is undertaking the next phase of the St George's Road consultation. Following on from consultation held in 2022, we would like to share how your input has helped shape the design for St George's Road and Charing Cross.

In this round of consultation there will be a focus on:

- ◆ Updated designs for St George's Road and Charing Cross

The updated design will see:

- ◆ New and enhanced public spaces and footways
- ◆ Pedestrian and cycle crossings
- ◆ Reallocation of road space
- ◆ Segregated cycle lanes
- ◆ Narrowed carriageway to reduce vehicle speeds
- ◆ Improved drop kerb access

We aim to deliver a desirable streetscape which is suitable for, and accessible by all.



About Connecting Woodside

Connecting Woodside is an area-wide project through Sustrans' Places for Everyone programme funded by Transport Scotland.

We want to work with the community to rebalance streets to reduce the dominance of road traffic and to improve streets and public spaces for people.
