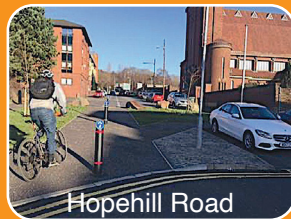
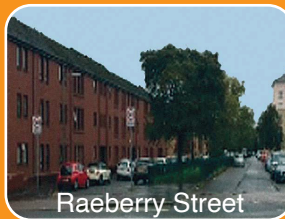

Glasgow City Council is undertaking the next phase of the Raeberry Street online consultation. Following on from consultations held in November 2021, we would like to share how your input has shaped the design for Raeberry Street and to get your views on the next phase of the project.

In this round of consultation there will be a focus on:

- ◆ Updated designs for Raeberry Street

The updated design will see:

- ◆ Relocated Signal crossing to better connect Raeberry Street with Trossachs Street
- ◆ New and enhanced public spaces, lighting and footways
- ◆ Narrowed carriageway to reduce vehicle speeds
- ◆ Improved drop kerb access
- ◆ Increased green spaces

We aim to deliver a desirable streetscape which is suitable for, and accessible by all.



About Connecting Woodside

Connecting Woodside is an area-wide project through Sustrans' Places for Everyone programme funded by Transport Scotland.

We want to work with the community to rebalance streets to reduce the dominance of road traffic and to improve streets and public spaces for people.
